WORDS FROM THE PASTOR - November 2023

November is Thanksgiving month. The timing and traditions of this holiday are based on events when harvests were collected at a time in our country when many more people were engaged in farming. Very few are full time farmers anymore, and football more than harvests seem to dominate the day now, but all of us still need the fruits of the earth these farmers grow to live, so giving thanks to God for them and all of His harvest blessings is certainly still appropriate!

As Christians we know we live and are saved by God's grace - by His gifts of both this earth and eternal salvation. But we should also remember that we were called to steward all of His gifts and respond to them with works of love for all of God's people - whether they are Christians or not.

November is also the month of our Congregational Meeting and planning budgets for another year. Stewardship is key to the life of a congregation so as a congregation we need to address that. So here goes:

A WORD ABOUT STEWARDSHIP

As we confront this next - and 'new' - phase of our congregation's life, we need to remember some 'old' truths and realities of what it takes to keep a congregation and its ministry going - and hopefully growing, too. In the main, we need to remember that as part of God's 'body,' we all need to play our part in keeping it active, strong and healthy. But thankfully, knowing that we are God's body, we know that He is and will always be with us as we do so.

First, we need to acknowledge what Scripture reminds us - that everything we have is - and comes from - Him:

- Psalm 24:1 The earth is the Lord's and the fullness thereof, the world and those who dwell therein.
- Genesis 1:29 And God said, "Behold, I have given you every plant yielding seed that is on the face of all the earth, and every tree with seed in its fruit. You shall have them for food.

Each month we will be including a short piece on stewardship. The first series is labeled the 8 "T"s of Stewardship: Time, Talent, Treasure, Testimony, Touch, Tissue, Trash and Technology, taken from materials prepared by Rev. John Heckmann, a consultant to the LWML.

T #1: TIME

Time is a gift from God:

- Psalm139:16 "Your eyes saw my unformed body;
 all the days ordained for me were written in your book before one of them came to be."
 and our time is limited here and depends on God.
- Psalm 39:5 "You have made my days a mere handbreadth; the span of my years is as nothing before you."

St. Paul reminds us what we are to do with our time in Romans 13:11-12:

 "Besides this you know the time, that the hour has come for you to wake from sleep. For salvation is nearer to us now than when we first believed. The night is far gone; the day is at hand. So then let us cast off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light."

And the Gospels reminds us of how our good use of time will be judged in Matthew 25:21:

His master said to him, 'Well done, good and faithful servant. You have been faithful over a little; I
will set you over much. Enter into the joy of your master.'

Ecclesiastes 3:1 reminds us that "there is a time for everything," and as a Christian, we need to take time to pray, read Scripture and worship at church to put us right with God and the world first and foremost before we do those 'works of the light' that God calls us to do in our vocations. Those vocational works start at home, but continue on in church, the workplace and school, as well as the community and society at large. And indeed, they are to stretch to the 'ends of the earth.' (Acts 13:47)

Not everyone has every gift to share in the work of loving God and loving neighbor, but everyone does have time, as long as they are alive, to be active in some way as part of God's body here and now. May the Lord lead us as we endeavor to follow His call, looking to Him for the way forward.

QUILT HARVEST

On Sunday, October 15, Trinity Quilters presented 39 new quilts for a Blessing; the Quilters were honored for their diligence, creativity, and service to the community. The quilts will go to the Parrott Creek Housing and Recovery Programs for distribution to their clients. The True Home group will receive 17 for the nine women and eight children in the program. The remaining will go to other women and children, including 5 'big kids' in Molalla House. S. Neumann, Parrott Creek Program Manager, stated that she would write a note to accompany each quilt explaining about the quilters' shared hands-on work and love that goes into making each quilt with the hope that each recipient will find comfort and rest as they wrap themselves in their quilts. Parrott Creek staff will gift wrap the quilts and give them out at Christmas.

LWML 2023–2025 MISSION GRANT NO. 1 ORPHAN GRAIN TRAIN SERVANT CENTER ORPHAN GRAIN TRAIN | \$100,000



Orphan Grain Train began as an idea of a Lutheran pastor in northern Nebraska thirty years ago. It is a Lutheran volunteer network that ships donated food, clothing, medical supplies, and other needed items to people in the United States and seventy other countries around the world. Wherever Orphan Grain Train goes they try to work through the church, so the Gospel accompanies the assistance given. The main areas of their outreach are — providing assistance to orphans living primarily in Russia and former Russian satellites; supplying domestic disaster relief when hurricanes, floods, or drought cause extensive damage in the United States; gathering, sorting, packing, and distributing food, clothing, medical supplies and equipment, and educational materials to poverty-stricken people in the United States and internationally.

Orphan Grain Train started thirty years ago with a warehouse and sorting facility in Norfolk, Nebraska. As the ministry has grown, the current facilities in Norfolk have become outmoded and inadequate. The funds from this grant will help with the expenses for the new Orphan Grain Train Servant Center. The new center will have more of its resources under one roof as two of the buildings will be connected. A new drop off point will be separate from the loading dock. The Mercy Meals packaging area will be expanded, and the number of meals packaged can increase from five million a year to more than ten million a year. A break area for volunteers and an instructional area are also included in the plans. The updated center will be a safer work environment for the all-volunteer staff. Norfolk is just one of twenty-eight Orphan Grain Train warehouse sites across the U.S.

Once the Orphan Grain Train Servant Center is complete, it will serve millions of people both in the United States and around the world, bringing food, clothing, medical supplies and equipment, and educational materials tied with the lifesaving Gospel of Jesus Christ.

The Spirit of the Lord God is upon me, because the Lord has anointed me to bring good news to the poor; he has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and the opening of the prison to those who are bound (Isaiah 61:1).

Please support this worthy effort with your mites! If you use cash in your daily life, just drop your change in the same place every day at home, and then gather it into a Mite Box near the end of the month. If you use a checkbook, you can add your mite in your check register, rounding up every checkbook entry to the nearest dollar (or five dollars, or ten dollars...) and then drop a check for the Mite amount at the end of the month. You can do a similar action with your debit or credit card. A few cents here and there, and pretty soon you're talking about real money!

For the month ending August 31, 2023, the church reports a loss from operations of \$9,160. For the 8-month period ending August 31, 2023, the church reported an overall loss of \$31,904 from operations.

Connie explained some of the accounts on the Balance Sheet and Income Statement. Advent and Lent offerings were discussed and where the amounts are being recorded in the financials. Connie noted that the second payment on the air conditioners was paid for in August and that

amount is reflected in the properties section of the August financials.
