WORDS FROM THE PASTOR - December 2023

Here we are in Advent already. Advent means 'arrival, coming, or incoming.' Advent in the Church is when we wait for both the past coming and the second coming of Jesus. It begins our new Church Year.

The first Gospel reading in our lectionary takes us to Palm Sunday and Jesus' last week on this earth before his death and resurrection. Palm Sunday happened to fulfill the words above that come from Zechariah: Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion! Shout aloud, O daughter of Jerusalem! Behold, your king is coming to you; righteous and having salvation is he, humble and mounted on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey. (9:9) But the words come to a people who, with Isaiah, look to someone - God - to come to rescue them from themselves and to create in them 'new hearts' - a new people - who would do His will in the world.

Behold, you were angry, and we sinned; in our sins we have been a long time, and shall we be saved?...

But now, O LORD, you are our Father; we are the clay, and you are our potter; we are all the work of your hand.

Be not so terribly angry, O LORD, and remember not iniquity forever. Behold, please look, we are all your people. Isaiah 64:5-9 (Excerpts)

It may seem strange that the church has chosen this Gospel text for the Christmas Season, but in it Jesus is recognized as Messiah in the fulfillment of the hopes of His people. His life will begin as a baby, but will lead to His greater purpose to be the King who will die for our sins on the cross in that mission to both cleanse us and re-create us for life here as HIs followers.

The story continues with His resurrection to start a new era of Anno(s) Domini or Years of our Lord on the earth as He reigns from Heaven. From there He will return at the end of time to judge this earth but also to usher in the New - and final - Heaven and Earth which we also all wait for.

We pray in the Lord's prayer for God's kingdom to come and God's will to be done. What does this mean? According to Luther, since "the good and gracious will of God is done even without our prayer," it means "asking that it comes to me" - to each one of us. This happens in Baptism, in listening to His Word, and in partaking of His Supper. These are His "means of grace," since in them His Holy Spirit comes to us, and to each He brings faith and the forgiveness of sin. May we continue to pray this prayer.

The Day of the Lord coming is indeed near - it is already here in us who are His. It comes to us as grace, as the Gospel, but it comes to us as a challenge, too, in the command to love others as He loved and loves us. May our King come to us all in a special way again this Christmas. And may we be a gift to each other and our neighbor in his name.

Each month we will be including a short piece on stewardship. The first series is labeled the 8 "T"s of Stewardship: **Time, Talent, Treasure, Testimony, Touch, Tissue, Trash** and **Technology**, taken from materials prepared by Rev. John Heckmann, a consultant to the LWML.

T #2: TALENT

Our talents include the gifts, skills and abilities that God has given us.

Romans and 1 Corinthians 12 speak about the 'spiritual GIFTS' that the Holy Spirit gives us according to His will, "Having gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, let us use them: if prophecy, in proportion to our faith; if service, in our serving; the one who teaches, in his teaching; the one who exhorts, in his exhortation; the one who contributes, in generosity; the one who leads, with zeal; the one who does acts of mercy, with cheerfulness."

These are to be for the benefit of the common good (1 Peter 4:10).

Using our God-given TALENTS wisely and well produces the fruit of the Sprit that Paul mentions in Galatians 5:22-23: But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control.

Of course, our God-given 'physical and mental SKILLS and ABILITIES,' like those needed in building, mechanics, accounting and computing, business, civil service of all kinds, farming and gardening, cooking and baking, and even sports can also serve God, the congregation and our neighbors, too!

Make every effort to discover your gifts, skills, and abilities and find ways to put them to work in our congregation in service to both God and neighbor.

SUNDAY ADULT BIBLE STUDY

On Sunday, November 5 we began a Bible Study entitled "Unshakable: Standing on the Rock When Life Quakes Hard", by Donna Snow. We are walking through the lives of eight remarkable men and women whom God shook to the core, then used to point people to the hope of salvation. We learn their history, we peer into their struggles, and see how God moved in their lives to teach us vital spiritual lessons today.

Remaining Biblical figures we'll be studying are: **James**: From Doubting Brother to Impactful Leader; **Mary Magdalene**: From Demon-Possessed to Devoted Disciple; **Paul**: From Persecuting Pharisee to Passionate Advocate; **Gideon**: From Fearful Judge to Faithful Warrior; and **John**: From Humble Fisherman to Beloved Disciple.

LWML 2023–2025 MISSION GRANT NO. 3 SERVING GOD'S CHILDREN WITH SPECIAL NEEDS JOURNEYS LUTHERAN SCHOOL | \$100,000



For 60 years, the distinctive ministry of Journeys Lutheran School has been to serve God's children with special needs such as attention deficit hyperactivity disorder, learning disabilities, attention deficit disorder, autism, anxiety, trauma, emotional behavior disorder, and obsessive-compulsive disorders. Families choose Journeys Lutheran School for a variety of reasons, including emotional and spiritual growth, a Christian worldview, an educational approach that works best for their unique student, or a more therapeutic approach to education.

We are all God's children despite our differences, challenges, or experiences. Journeys Lutheran School prepares students in Grades 3–12 with unique learning challenges to maximize their God-given spiritual, academic, physical, emotional, and social potential. The resources and experience of Journeys provides academic help to students and provides an opportunity for their lives to be touched by the Holy Spirit through devotions, prayer, Christian counseling, religion classes, and personal witness.

Grant funds will purchase two 15-passenger vans. The vans will allow Journeys to reach and teach more students and meet their academic and spiritual needs. In addition to the school bus already in use, the vans will provide alternative means to reach students in areas outside of Milwaukee. Additionally, the vans will transport youth to Martin Luther High School, a ministry partner, so that Journeys students can take elective classes in a Christian mainstream environment. This will enable Journeys students to earn a high school diploma, not just a certificate of completion. The vans will also transport students to potential school-to-work internship opportunities and to transport students to cultural, historical, and spiritual learning experiences without needing to use the full-size school bus.

Journeys children deserve the same educational and spiritual opportunities that other children enjoy. The van will help them experience the fullness of God's creation by opening the world and all its possibilities and opportunities to them.

Rhoda opened the meeting with a prayer and shared a devotion titled Naps: Resting when you're awake and resting with God.

September minutes were approved.

Cary Martenson attended as a guest to discuss the 2024 Rancho Santa Marta mission trip and the excess donations/fundraising given from the 2022 trip which were approximately \$5,500. Connie has contacted the bookkeeper to see where the excess amount was posted in the financials.

Sheila reported Sunshine school doesn't have their occupancy permit yet. Brian asked who is on the Facilities Use committee, it was noted that the current committee consists of Gail Allen, Sheila Wahl, Craig Nichols, Carolyn Stucky, Paula Bennett, and Stanette Rosenberger. Sheila said the school keeps a record of who comes in and out with school key codes. J. Pat and Carol have a list of the building keys and who has which keys.

Pastor noted that Outreach is sponsoring "Trunk or Treat" in October and there will be a movie night in November. December will be Advent by Candlelight.

For the month ending September 30, 2023, the church reports a loss from operations of \$9,631. For the 9-month period ending September 30,

2023, the church reported an overall loss of \$41,536 from operations.

Council gives the Treasurer approval to correct account postings as needed during the year. Closing entries at year end need council approval such as moving funds from restricted funds to balance the budget.

It was agreed that we can move \$5,500 from Outreach Temp Restricted funds to cover the 2024 short term mission trip to Rancho Santa Marta.

Council approved moving \$30,000 from Properties Temp Restricted funds to cover the shortfall in Properties maintenance/improvements due to the repairs needed on the air conditioners in 2022.

Council reviewed the proposed 2024 budget. Congregation will vote on the proposed budget in the November 2023 Congregation meeting.
