## WORDS FROM THE PASTOR - November 2022

*"Bless the Lord, O my soul! O Lord my God, you are very great!  
You are clothed with splendor and majesty, covering yourself with light as with a garment, stretching out the heavens like a tent. (Psalm 104:1)*

Psalm 104 is one of several acrostic poems found in the Bible, which means that its verses are divided into 22 stanzas, one for each of the 22 characters that make up the Hebrew alphabet, with each stanza beginning with the successive Hebrew letter. I suggest you read all of it - even if only in English - and if you do, you will see that it recounts the Creation.

What is so striking about the creation it describes, that is, the one we live in, is how God is so personally involved in it and delighted by it. He even 'clothes' Himself with the light of it.

Fall with all of its colors is for many the most beautiful season - or at least the one that brings nature to our attention most; nature in all its splendor but also nature that is subject to cycles - life and death and life again. Harvests come in the Fall - harvests that signal food for ongoing life for us, even as it means 'death' for the plants that we live off.

God calls us to 'die,' too - to our egos, that we might be 'fruit' for the benefit of all. "For whoever would save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will find it." (Matthew 16:25). Or, to use a metaphor from nature, as Jesus did: "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains alone; but if it dies, it bears much fruit." (John 12:24)

But spiritual 'death' gives way to a much greater spiritual 'rebirth and life' with our God, both now and for eternity. Using another metaphor from nature Jesus tell us to: "Abide in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit by itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in me." (John 15:4)

Jesus' own real death and resurrection, in which He gave His life for us and our salvation by taking away the consequences of our sin is the 'first fruit' that we depend on for our own new life, which begins with our baptism. Abiding in Jesus and His love transforms us into very different people than we start as, however. Lives lived in community and for the common good, and not just for ourselves. Comparing us to the 'nations,' Jesus speaks to how we are NOT to be like those who would 'rule' over others with their power and opinions, but rather that "whoever would be great among you must be a servant." (Matthew 20:26).

It is to love God and love neighbor - as God showed us in Jesus - that God called us to from the start in the Creation, His delight. As children of Adam we failed in this, but now as His chosen and beloved children, born again in Baptism and washed in the blood of Jesus, God invites us again to find His same delight in living with Him here as His, now and then forever in the New Creation. Thanks be to God for our Creation - and for us and ours in it!

## THANKSGIVING

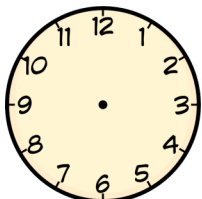

Pastor began the meeting with a prayer.

The August meeting minutes were approved.

**Christian Education:** Carolyn Stucky (Present-No Report)

Carolyn reported CE had a meeting early September, mostly Rally day planning. Rally day was successful and there was enough food for everyone. Sunday school classes started this last Sunday. CE would like to move Sunday school classes to 10:15 am at some point. It was suggested that the adult bible class should be announced after service. VBS material for next year has been ordered since there was a discount to order early. Classrooms need cleaned during Doing Sunday. Thank you notes were sent out to VBS helpers and notes with pictures will be sent soon.

**Outreach:** Pastor Ted/Connie Adams (Present-No Report)

The "Day of Doing" is coming up. One project will be making packets to hang on doors, Scott is working on getting permission to hang these. If we can't hang at the new apartments, they will be passed out to members to give out to neighbors, etc.

**AVIT:** Paul Petrone (Not in Attendance-No Report)

Troy talked to AVIT group about what the technical plans are. There are a couple people ready to get trained. We can't make any changes until we have double the AVIT people.

**Pastor Report:** Pastor Ted (Present-No Report)

Pastor noted that he does a lot of visitations and it would be nice to have help with visitations.

**Elders:** Craig Nickles (Present-No Report)

Elders are meeting the 3rd Sunday of each month in between services. Craig emphasized to the Elders that they must be calling members on their list. Craig is resigning as head elder but will remain an elder. Jeff Allen has agreed to step up and be head elder effective November 1. Craig and Jeff will share the responsibility of attending council meetings.

**Treasurer Report:** Melissa Deyoe (Present-See Report)

For the month ending August 31, 2022, the church reports a loss from operations of \$5,042. For the 8 month period ending August 31, 2022, the church reports an overall loss of \$12,966 from operations. Offerings are down. We have lost several members over the past two years. Connie noted that online giving has been a positive thing. Melissa met with J Pat and

Carol and received some good feedback for updating their contract. Herb asked about the funds for repairing the AC units. It was suggested that we get a quote for two new units since the freon is so expensive. Connie asked about consolidating restricted outreach funds. Melissa said that in the past the restricted funds that fall below \$50 have been consolidated with other restricted funds.

**Property Board:** Herb Meissel (Present-No Report)

Herb reported there is a lot to do. The "Day of Doing" is coming up on Sunday. AC units have been repaired. Eventually we will need to replace some of the old units, they are estimated to last about 20-25 years and ours are currently 20 years old. There are 11 total units and 2 are currently not working. Herb is going to put a list of jobs that need done on the bulletin board. It has been suggested that people bring weed eaters, chain saws, etc. as equipment to the Day of Doing.

Carolyn asked some questions about leaders. Are you serving out of responsibility or out of the love of Jesus?
