WORDS FROM THE PASTOR - March 2025

"Yet even now," declares the Lord,
"return to me with all your heart,
with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning;

and rend your hearts and not your garments."

Return to the Lord your God,

for he is gracious and merciful,

slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love. Joel (2:12-13)

Lent is upon us. This is our special period of both introspection and expectation. In this season the 'mirror' of the Law leads us to look in at ourselves and realize how far we are from being the perfect people God expects us to be (Matthew 5:48).

At this time it is also a reminder to us to look at how we are as a congregation. The Lord has blessed this one with over 100 years of fellowship and Christian community. What a blessing that is - one that not many churches in the area can point to! There is a strong 'remnant' of that still here. How can we use that strength to be both an example and a magnet to others in a God-pleasing way? And how can we in any - and every - case be God's "hands and feet" as we are able to those outside of our congregation?

God calls us to be perfect - but are we that? St. Paul reminds us in Romans 3 - and especially in verse 23 - that no, we aren't, and no one is or can be.

Our introspection is surely 'good, right and salutary,' but it should lead us not to despair. Rather, it should point to the expectation that also comes with the season - the expectation of Good Friday at its end. On that day, so good for us though hardly so for our Savior, with His suffering and death Jesus paid for all of our sins and shortfallings with His life-giving sacrifice. In so doing He saves us in that 'Glorious Exchange' of our sins for his righteousness, which we hold to in faith for our salvation.

But Jesus didn't stay dead - no, on Easter he rose from the dead and lives in heaven and in us. And as He now gives us His ministry He also gives us HIs assurance that He will be with us in ours if we let Him.

So, let us look to him - to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith (Heb. 12:2).

As we look in that mirror at ourselves, let us not forget to see who else is there in us and for us - Jesus. May He bless us in a special way in these special days. Amen.

NEW PASTOR CALL PROCESS - Information from the Board of Elders

As most of you already know, Trinity Lutheran Church, Oregon City, will need to Call a new pastor in the upcoming months as our current pastor, Pastor Ted Engelbrecht, will be retiring in June. According to Trinity's Bylaws (Article VII), the Board of Elders is given the task of doing the preliminary work of preparing to call a pastor. Their task is to do the necessary tasks required by the Northwest District of the Lutheran Church, Missouri Synod, obtain a list of potential candidates from the Northwest District President, interview the chosen candidates, and then present a list of candidates to the congregation to be voted on at a congregational assembly.

We are guided in the Call Process by our Circuit Visitor, who is appointed by the District to assist congregations in the process. The Board of Elders met with Pastor Jim Sprengle, our Circuit Visitor, on January 22, to discuss the Call Process. Then, Pastor Sprengle attended a specially called Congregational Meeting on February 23 to explain the process to the congregational members in attendance and to answer any questions any of the members had.

At the meeting on February 23, Pastor Sprengle talked about what it means to "call" a pastor and how the process is different than just "hiring" a new person to be our pastor. We depend on the Holy Spirit to led us and any pastor that we call to a God pleasing decision.

Trinity's Board of Elders has already taken some of the necessary steps in the process, including having requested and received a demographic study from Lutheran Church Extension Fund (LCEF). This demographic study will help us to take a look at the makeup and changes of our area and will help in evaluating our current situation by completing a self-study provided by the District.

One of the next steps will be for the congregation to hold a Congregational Meeting at which the members of Trinity will make several important decisions as to the steps we would like to take in calling a new pastor. We will need to decide if we want to go with a Vacancy Pastor or a Transitional Interim Minister. Pastor Sprengle explained that if we choose to go with a Vacancy Pastor, we then need to decide if we will seek a candidate from one of the two LCMS seminaries (St. Louis and Fort Wayne) or if we will Call a Rostered Pastor who is currently serving at another LCMS congregation.

If we seek a new seminary graduate, we will wait until October to let the District Office know that is our desire and then wait until the graduates are placed in the spring of 2026. Pastor Sprengle explained that for this year, there are 150 LCMS congregations seeking a seminary graduate, and there are approximately 80 graduates available from the two seminaries, so many congregations that request a graduate will not receive one.

If we decide to call a rostered pastor who is already serving at a church elsewhere, we will get started right away on forming a call committee, completing and submitting our self-study to the District Office, and then the District President will give us a list of potential candidates for us to contact and interview. It usually takes several months for the District President to compile a list of potential candidates for a church.

We also have the option of instead of choosing a Vacancy Pastor, going with a Transitional Interim Pastor. This pastor would serve our congregation for usually 6 to 18 months to help us do anything we might need to do to be ready to call a new pastor. The call process would not begin until the Transitional Interim Pastor has completed preparing the congregation for the call process, so that would mean we would wait a year or so to start the call process. Some congregations find it very helpful to have a Transitional Interim Pastor before they begin the call process, and some congregations find it is not necessary to go through that extra step before beginning the call process. That is what we will need to decide at a Congregational Meeting in the near future.

So, we ask that you keep this search for a new pastor in your prayers, and watch for notification of a Congregational Meeting to make the first decisions that we need to make in order to call a new pastor. If you have any questions, please contact any of the Elders for answers to your questions.

PRESIDENT'S CORNER March 2025

The Christian 2025 Season of Lent begins March 5 with Ash Wednesday. Trinity will observe Ash Wednesday with a service on March 5th at 7pm. I wondered how the greater world defined Lent. A Google search produced the following notes, some of which I didn't know, so I thought to share them:

- Lent is a forty-day period of prayer and fasting leading up to Easter (actually, 46 days because Sundays are not counted)
- Lent symbolizes the time Jesus spent fasting in the desert
- Lenten pillars are Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving
- The three 'R's of Lent are, Reflection, Repentance, and Reconciliation
- Sixth century Pope St. Gregory the Great added dispensing of ashes, thus the name Ash Wednesday. Bible references: Mathew 4:1-11, Mark 1:13, and Luke 4:1-13

Trinity has a website found at www.trinityoc.org – have you seen it? This is one of the ways Trinity reaches out to the community and provides a resource for our own members. The Church Council has engaged professional website manager Lee Truax to manage the site and Trinity's Ahtia Clack to be Trinity's AV Coordinator; they are working together on website improvements and updates.

2023–2025 MISSION GRANT NO. 30 | SHOWERING LOVE ON THE LEAST OF THESE | MERCY HOLISTIC MINISTRY | \$100,000 | Washing by the Water and the Word

Reverend Berhanu Didanu, from the Lutheran Church Mekane Yesus in Ethiopia, along with his wife, Miheret Abebe, and their family came to the United States in 2007, to serve as missionaries to the "least of these" in the Sacramento area. Knowing that all people are created in God's Image, loved by God in Jesus, and need to experience that love every day in a multitude of ways, they founded Mercy Holistic Ministry (MHM) in 2010.

In 2021, MHM purchased a portable, two stall shower trailer, bringing showers and the Gospel to parks, parking lots, and community locations around Sacramento where unhoused people live. The trailer is fully self-contained, providing hot water and

capturing the wastewater. It houses two spacious shower stalls with a room for dressing. Each shower stall is fully cleaned and sanitized between each guest.

Following the shower and haircut, people are offered opportunities to speak more in-depth with someone who can pray with them, provide active listening, and make referrals for other services. While their physical needs are addressed, these underserved people will hear that the blood of Jesus washes their sins away and gives eternal life to them.



The grant will fund the increased frequency of mobile hot shower services and haircuts from two days per week to three days per week and serve 2,000 more people annually. A mobile trailer will be purchased and retrofitted to be a closet for clean clothing and hygiene kits that will be given away. God's Word will be shared by distributing 10 to 15 Bibles and prayer books every week. In the last several years the homeless population in Sacramento has doubled to 10,000 people. These services enhance the feeling of worth and dignity, provide hope in Jesus, and give counseling to aid the homeless in applying for jobs or securing an apartment.

And the King will answer them, "Truly I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brothers, you did it to me" (Matthew 25:40).

He saved us through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit, whom he poured out on us generously through Jesus Christ our Savior (Titus 3:5b).
