WORDS FROM THE PASTOR

The date for Easter follows the Jewish Lunar Calendar which determines when Passover is, which is why it changes and why it is so late this year. But Lent is finally coming to its end - or rather, its conclusion - in Holy Week and Easter.

When Jesus said 'it is finished' on the cross the word he used in Greek is a form of the root word 'telos,' which means more like "it is accomplished" or "it is completed," rather than "it is all done." (Think - the meal is prepared for eating rather than it is all eaten up!)

For indeed, Jesus' death on the cross was the beginning of something more than an end to it. With his death comes new life, beginning with His resurrection, as we read in 2 Corinthians 5:14ff

"For the love of Christ controls us, because we have concluded this: that one has died for all, therefore all have died; and he died for all, that those who live might no longer live for themselves but for him who for their sake died and was raised.

From now on, therefore, we regard no one according to the flesh. Even though we once regarded Christ according to the flesh, we regard him thus no longer. Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come. All this is from God, who through Christ reconciled us to himself and gave us the ministry of reconciliation;"

In these verses we have a good example of the paradigm of Christian life and Lutheran theology: Law-Gospel-Challenge. We see the Law, which shows us our sin, which has to be paid for by death, is paid for us by Jesus. This is the Gospel. But we often forget the third part of this - our response to this wonderful and salvific news. The Challenge here is that He now has given that ministry of reconciliation to us - meaning that we are now called to pass on that good news - the Gospel - to others.

We Lutherans remember well the first part of the most famous words in Ephesians, which start in verses 8-9:

"For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast."

But we often forget verse 10, which follows directly:

"For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them."

As we end our Lenten time of remembering our sins, let us not forget our Savior, who died for them and with that makes us a 'new creation' in Him. But let us also remember that He died for everyone's sins and He counts on us to witness to that as we follow His command to not just love God, but to love our neighbors whomever they might be, too. We do this not just by sharing our faith, but by attending to their earthly needs, too. Amen.

MISSION GRANT NO. 1

Proclaiming The Gospel-Serve with Mercy, \$5000

The LCMS Office of National Mission extends its mission outreach, education, and mercy work through Independent Recognized Service Organizations (RSOs) whose programs are in harmony with the Lutheran doctrine and practices of the LCMS. RSOs serve the needs of all God's people and may sometimes need assistance with resources to proclaim the Gospel. They may also receive requests for resources such as Bibles, devotional materials, and resources for their leadership team. This grant will purchase needed resources and provide ministry training to support their Lutheran identity in Word and Sacrament.

MISSION GRANT NO. 4

Life-Changing Care for People in The Dominican Republic Living with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities, \$6,500

The LCMS started mission work in the Dominican Republic in 2005 with a specific emphasis on improving the lives of people with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) by providing spiritual, physical, and emotional care as Children of God.



Six young adults living in a group home, Hogares Luteranos el Buen Pastor (Good Shephard Lutheran Home), need continued care while confronting the way a country cares for God's children with disabilities. This home allows residents to remain in their Dominican community while interacting with neighbors, friends, church members, and visitors as they grow in Jesus's love and His Word.
