ELDERS UPDATE

Pastor Hagen's Vacancy Pastor agreement with Trinity went through the end of December 2025. Because of other commitments, he will not be able to continue as Trinity's Vacancy Pastor into 2026. We are very thankful that he has been able to serve at Trinity these past six months.

Our Circuit Visitor, Pastor Sprengle, said that he is not aware of any other pastors that would be able to fill in as a Vacancy Pastor at this time. Several other area churches are in the same position as we are, without a pastor and no Vacancy Pastor available. So we will be without a full-time or Vacancy Pastor for the foreseeable future.

Most churches in this position have different retired pastors fill-in to preach on Sundays from week-to-week. Trinity will do the same for now. We are blessed that Pastor Ted Engelbrecht, who retired in June, and Pastor David Keil, who has filled in at Trinity in the past, are both willing to help with the preaching duties at Trinity at least through April. So we will use them from January through April.

We are also blessed that Northwest District President Michael Von Behren will be with us on Sunday, January 4, to deliver the sermon and meet with the congregation for a short time after the fellowship time to answer any questions congregational members might have and to offer encouragement to us as we travel through this journey.

Pastor Engelbrecht and Pastor Keil will only be preaching on Sundays. They will not be doing any other duties that Pastor Hagen has been doing as our Vacancy Pastor. So the other duties, such as visiting sick/homebound/hospitalized members, will be need to be done by Elders and other members of Trinity. If you or someone you know needs a visit starting in January, please contact the church office. Elder Dave Wilson will be coordinating those needed visits. Contact any of the Elders if you have questions or concerns.

PRESIDENT'S CORNER - NEW OPPORTUNITIES

January, the first month of our calendar year! A New Year begins. What are we going to do with it? Are we going to be open to change or will we be satisfied with the status quo? As Elder Jeff Allen has reported, we are beginning again on our search for the pastor God wants to serve at Trinity. Please keep the Church Council in your prayers as they review options.

On January 25, we will have a Special Congregation Meeting to elect a lay delegate to cast our vote for LCMS President for the coming three years. Cary Martensen has agreed to run for this position. Also, as part of the 'housekeeping' that the Council has undertaken in the past year or so, a revised version of the Bylaws is being prepared for your review and vote on the 25th. A review copy will be available soon; you are invited to submit comments to the Church Council before the meeting. No changes are proposed in the Trinity Constitution.

There are opportunities at every turn. To offer a kind word, provide a helping hand and support one another. On Sunday afternoon, December 28, Trinity hosted the congregation of the Reformation Covenant Church (RCC), Oregon City, for their worship service. Their church building, (*trinity's old building downtown*), suffered a serious fire on Christmas Day.

They expressed many a 'Thank You' to Trinity for making a space available for them to come together to worship and pray after their loss. Many said that Trinity felt very comfortable and familiar as they remarked on the banners in the Narthex being like the windows in the old church.

Trinity served coffee and Safeway and Albertsons donated desserts for a time of hospitality after the service. It will take some time to return their building to useable condition; RCC is considering renting space from Trinity during reconstruction. It was good to be able to offer this support to our Brothers and Sisters in Christ during their time of need.



Mites received for Oregon District Mission Grants this biennium through December 27, 2025: \$50,151.96

#1 Proclaiming The Gospel-Serve with Mercy, \$5000

The LCMS Office of National Mission extends its mission outreach, education, and mercy work through independent Recognized Service Organizations (RSOs) whose programs are in harmony with the Lutheran doctrine and practices of the LCMS. RSOs serve the needs of all God's people and may sometimes need assistance with resources to proclaim the Gospel. They may also receive requests for resources such as Bibles, devotional materials, and resources for their leadership team. This grant will purchase needed resources and provide ministry training to support their Lutheran identity in Word and Sacrament.



#3. Life-Changing Care for People Living with Intellectual & Developmental Disabilities-\$6500

The LCMS started mission work in the Dominican Republic in 2005 with a specific emphasis on improving the lives of people with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) by providing spiritual, physical, and emotional care as Children of God. This home allows residents to remain in their Dominican community while interacting with neighbors, friends, church members, and visitors as they grow in Jesus's love and His Word.



#6. Expanding Gospel Proclamation Worldwide-Concordia Seminary, \$6500

Most countries have a significant shortage of Lutheran pastors with advanced theological education. The global proclamation of Christ's love and the message of eternal salvation through faith in Christ continues to be paramount. Theological education is one of the critical priorities of the LCMS Synod. This grant will offset international students' educational costs that are not covered by other contributions.



#9. Oregon District Unequally Yoked Workshop, \$4000

This grant aims to educate the leadership, congregations, and especially college-aged young women of the Oregon District with a better understanding of the Islamic doctrine to prevent them from being wooed away from the Christian faith. This POBLO training, consisting of a workshop and training kits, has been developed to sharpen the distinction between the identity and mindset of Disciples of Christ in contrast to Islam's carnal/spiritual view.
