WORDS FROM THE PASTOR - September 2022

September means the return to school for students and teachers alike.

School in the usual sense usually refers to a building with classrooms full of books and activities that teachers help take students through on the way to learning - often only of theoretical things in theoretical ways.

But 'school' in a more general sense can be everywhere at anytime when learning takes place. And that's what took place when the mission team from Trinity OC went to San Vincente in Mexico last month to spend time at Rancho Santa Marta. While at the ranch we helped prepare school classrooms for their new school year, but also did VBS with the full time residents there - 40 children/young people of various ages and abilities that the ranch houses in 4 'family homes.' Some of the residents are either orphans or were abandoned by or taken away from parents who were not able or fit to take care of them, while others were developmentally disabled with nowhere to go.

During VBS times, these residents were taught many things, but what struck me and others in our group most was the change/growth/learning that took place in the young people that we took along as they worked with and interacted with the residents. Horizons were expanded and some bubbles burst as they learned more about themselves, the world and how different it and people can be. God, indeed, is not a 'one style' only creator, and neither is He finished with any of us at any point, even unto death. He wants us to keep learning and growing our whole lives, and gives us the opportunity to do so. All we have to do - initially anyway - is to be open to being changed; opened to finding a much bigger us, world and God than we could ever imagine without Him.

The texts in our liturgical year at this time focus on Christian living, and God's teachings on what that involves. At the heart is His command to 'Love God and Love Others as Ourselves.' It is that process of looking - and loving - outside of ourselves that chiefly grows and teaches us, which is why God commands it in the first place!

May we continue to be lifelong learners at the feet - and cross - of Christ, who along with the Father, who created us, and the Holy Spirit who enlightens and enlivens us, teaches us that:

"Whoever would save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake and the gospel's will save it." (Mark 8:35).

FOOD DONATIONS NEEDED...

A recent news story reported on the struggle that food banks are having, with more people needing assistance as inflation hits their pocketbook, and prices at the store going up – which means that the donors to the food banks are impacted as well.

Our food donation barrel is back out. We may not be able to multiply loaves, but just putting one extra thing in your cart as you shop can make a difference in someone's life. Keeping an eye on the sales flyers can help your dollars stretch a bit further as well, and checking prices between stores can help. Shelf tags can reveal bargains - recently, for example, Grocery Outlet had Mac & Cheese boxes for 7 cents, and a couple of weeks later, Winco had Mac & Cheese for 68 cents. Do you know where your grocery store's discount shelf is? (Hint: at Fred Meyer and Safeway, it's near the dairy section). Sales, closeouts or specials – if it's something you would eat, it's something that a person struggling to feed a family will appreciate.

As you may be aware, we now have a non-profit organization renting space here at Trinity. Here is some information that the Executive Director, April Lambert Wige, wanted to share with you about the organization and its mission - *editor*.

Thank you Trinity Lutheran Church for welcoming Yona's Kids into your wonderful community! We would like to introduce ourselves and tell you a little about who we are, how we got started, and what we are accomplishing here at Trinity Lutheran Church.

Yona's Kids was founded in honor of our precious son, Yona Ryan Wige. Though he had only three short months of life due to complications from Down Syndrome, the love he brought into this world will carry on for many generations to come through the work of this organization.

Our mission is to love, serve, and protect people from conception forward. Together with our volunteers from both the *Easter Seals Senior Community Service Employment Program* and the *Clackamas Community College Corporative Work Experience Program*, we are working to make a difference for children in the womb by creating awareness about misdiagnosed miscarriages, connecting people to helpful resources for miscarriage and grief support, assisting children and families in the foster care system, helping individuals who are unemployed/underemployed, those recovering from domestic violence, as well as, striving to improve equity for seniors and people with disabilities. We provide education, support, resources, and referral services for individuals and for other organizations. Additionally, we are working towards building community memorials for people to have a place to process grief and have remembrance of their loved ones. Your church has made it possible for us to partner with the Easter Seals Senior Community Service Employment Program to offer job skills training while carrying out the important work of our organization.

We are going to start our new round of virtual domestic violence recovery classes and job search/job skills classes on Zoom next week.
