## WORDS FROM THE PASTOR

"O LORD, our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the Earth!" *Psalms 8*

Driving or walking around this part of the country at this time of year the trees and colors are sometimes so beautiful it can take our breath away. How majestic, indeed, is He, our Creator, who made all this!

And how gracious our Creator and Preserver is, too, as harvests once again come in and the earth provides her bounty of food for us for another year. It is "truly meet, right and salutary," that we give thanks for all this on a special day this month, even as we need to in each and every month, as well.

He who preserves us now on this earth also redeems us and reconciles us with our creator and so preserves us for life eternal with Him. As such He sanctifies us, making us saints, giving us His own righteousness. His Holy Spirit also continues to work in us through His Word and Sacraments, however, so the sinner in us continues to grow in faith and good works.

All this, Luther reminds us in the Catechism in his explanation of the First Article of the Creed, God does "only out of fatherly, divine, goodness and mercy, without any merit or worthiness in me."

So we see the LORD - Yahweh - is Creator, Preserver, Redeemer, Sanctifier as well as Lord and Father. And the list goes on and on of His attributes.

This is the time of year when we remember certain things/day in our history and life and God's role in them.. We just celebrated All Saints' Day (All Hallows Eve - Halloween), the Reformation and will soon celebrate Thanksgiving. In the first we can include ourselves as having been sainted by God in Jesus, and in the last each one of us has been fed by God's bounty in nature.

In remembering the Reformation we also remember something very personal. Theologians in the Church have done much to try to explain what and who God is, as well as describing mankind, sin and pretty much everything else in philosophical terms. Luther was much more practical - indeed relational - since he didn't believe we could know much of all that. For him, what was important was the relationship between God and us, God and sin, and God and righteousness, for example.

For him, and for us, what is most important is why God does what He does - and for whom. And to add to what He says about God as Father creating out of 'fatherly divine, goodness and mercy' in making us, he adds that God as Son and Redeemer does what He does "that each of us might be His own."

So for us, we remember that God creates **us**, preserves and redeems **us**, loves **us** - all so that we can be **His**.

"O LORD, our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the Earth!" Thank You for loving us and for all You do to make us your own. Amen.

## REOPENING TRINITY

I was looking at one of the charts put out by the state that shows the daily COVID infection reports. When you look at the data, it shows a number of “waves” of infection that we’ve gone through. However, the last wave is different: while it followed the same exponential rise as the prior waves, it’s been a lot slower to drop down. The estimate is that, between the high transmissibility of the Delta variant, the current use of masks, the number of those vaccinated, and the raw number of people who have been infected and gained some level of immunity, the “R-Value” for the pandemic is currently 0.9.

What the R-Value tells us, is for every person who gets infected, how many do they, in turn, infect? An R-Value greater than 1.0 means that the virus is spreading more wildly; for example, if the R-Value is 2, then each person infected will likely infect two more. If it’s 1, then each person infects one more. If it’s less than one—then the number of infections will slowly drop over time.

The state’s current estimate is that we’ll reach the coveted “Herd Immunity” on December 26. Obviously, the day before is a day that could be a source of spread for the virus, inasmuch as many families will be gathering without wearing masks, and those who are infected may be able to infect others in the gathering.

Unfortunately, “Herd Immunity” doesn’t mean that the pandemic is over. It just means that there’s enough immunity in the “herd” (us humans) that a wildfire spread of the infection isn’t likely. It doesn’t mean that it won’t still spread. Also, it’s likely that there will be some parts of the state where the herd isn’t all that immune yet, whether due to a lack of vaccination or fewer prior infections.

The state’s daily emails include a chart that shows the number of infections reported each day. But if you click on the chart, another page opens, and you get to see more data. One of the interesting things is that Clackamas County’s “rate per 100,000” remains about the seventh lowest in the state. That number is calculated based on the prior seven-day average. So, *there is good news*—the rate of spread in our county remains lower than most of the rest of the state (and you have to remember that some of those counties have more cows than people). We may be emotionally exhausted by this pandemic, but we will get through it. How things go after the current mask mandate is lifted will depend largely on several things: how immune the herd really is (immunity from both infections and vaccines wanes over time), how many people still take reasonable precautions once they aren’t *required*, what new variants develop and spread, and probably some other factors that aren’t listed here.

Early in 2020, the Seattle Times published a few articles that looked back at the 1918 flu pandemic. It, too, had waves of infection (four), people refusing to wear a mask to reduce transmission, and bore some resemblance to our current COVID-19 pandemic. Perhaps Solomon was right in Ecclesiastes 1:9, as far as human behavior goes: *there is nothing new under the sun.*

## **OUTREACH: MEALS FOR THOSE IN NEED**

This pesky pandemic threw a wrench into our routine, and we're still not back to normal - just like everyone else.

We are still gathering on the Second Saturday of the month to prepare a meal for the Transition Projects, which supports people who are putting their lives back together after addiction treatment. Transition Projects offers housing, meals, and support as they seek employment and get ready to transition to living on their own. Our meal, once a month, is one way in which God provides for those are getting their lives back on track. Once pandemic restrictions ease, we will be able to actually serve the meal, rather than just drop it off, and interact with their clients and share God's love for them.



On the third Wednesday of the month, we deliver lunch to The Father's Heart. We look forward to being able to actually serve the meal, but for now, we drop it off. However, feeding that many people takes more than just one morning for us - so we gather the night before to do all the cooking of hot meal items. Slicing, dicing, mixing, stirring, are a few of the qualifications needed to help with this meal prep. If you can bake, roast, or even just clean up, your talents are needed! Wednesday morning is a time to reheat the cooked dishes and do some of the cold prep, then pack it all up, take it all down, and drop it all off. The Father's Heart staff then serves the meal (*we're just a bit jealous, but not to the level of sinfulness, since we used to get to serve it*) to homeless individuals and others in need in our community.

Once again this year, we'll be having a special collection of gobblers and oinkers - turkeys and hams - to help supply meals for these outreach ministries.

Trinity collects non-perishable items in the red barrel at the office entrance to the church. Please be sure to label any donations left at church, as the barrel is used to collect for several ministries.

### **THE HOLIDAYS ARE COMING...**

The holiday season is just around the corner. For Christians, it is a wonderful time of year. Thanksgiving is a special time just to reflex on how wonderful our God is and the amazing gifts he has bestowed on each one of us. We then flow into the Christmas season, a joyous time as we celebrate the coming of the birth of our promised King. This is also a time of giving. As is Trinity's tradition we do this as a church family.

**THANKSGIVING** On November 7, our "I am thankful for tree" will be up in the narthex. Please take a leaf, write down what you are thankful for and hang it on the tree (you can take more than one leaf). Pastor will read these "thankful leaves" in following Sundays and may even incorporate into a sermon.

Also on November 7, Harvest bags will be handed out. We ask that you take them home, fill with canned and nonperishable food items, bring back to church and place on the bench to the right of the altar. Throughout the month of November, we can all watch it grow into a mountain of love. In December, the food will be dispersed to three food banks in the Oregon City area. A list of what kind of food to place in bags will be in Narthex. Last year we provided over 800 pounds of food to the food banks. The need is still great. Hint: children will be home from school, so snacky foods will be appreciated by the wee ones.

**CHRISTMAS** Our Giving Tree is and has been our biggest outreach project. Due to pandemic, we have to do this in two parts. Initially, we are asking for money donations. These donations will go toward gift cards for adults on our Christmas list and food for Christmas dinner for the various homes we sponsor. Last year we provided 40 gift cards for adults and food for six group homes. Checks may be made to Trinity Lutheran Church with Christmas in the memo line.

Right after Thanksgiving, the Giving Tree will go up. Christmas requests will be on tree for wee ones up through teenagers. All requests were fulfilled last year. We are also requesting that members donate a pair of socks be placed under the tree to be distributed to the homeless.

During this period of joy and giving and too much eating, we are doing our gobbler and oinker (turkey and ham) drive again. When you are purchasing your Thanksgiving turkey or Christmas ham, think about purchasing extra to donate to our church to be used for meals for the Transition program or The Father's Heart. Last year you provided the main ingredient for 1400 hot meals. (wow, way to go Trinity!). Also, a few of those turkeys went to families within our church.

**OTHER THINGS** Some have asked about big cookie baking day at the church. If enough are interested, we can do something like that. In November, a sign-up sheet will be placed in the narthex.
