WORDS FROM THE PASTOR - October 2024

I know that what follows is called 'Words from the Pastor,' but I'm going to start with some words from Wikipedia and the Internet about October, first.

"October is the tenth month of the year in the Julian and Gregorian calendars. Its length is 31 days. The eighth month in the old calendar of Romulus c. 750 BC, October retained its name (from Latin and Greek *ōctō* meaning "eight") after January and February were inserted into the calendar that had originally been created by the Romans."

"October is also a month of celebrating diverse heritages, including Polish American Heritage Month, German Heritage Month, Latin American Heritage Month, Hindu Heritage Month, Italian American Heritage Month, and Filipino American Month."

Although a few of those other countries represented in our congregation are not celebrating their heritages this month, it is 'good, right and salutary' to be reminded about just how diverse we as a country of immigrants are, but also just how even more diverse the Church as a body is. The Body of Christ includes ALL who believe. As St Paul puts it in Galatians 3:28: "There is neither Jew nor Gentile, neither slave nor free, nor is there male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus."

Ephesians 2:11 and following goes even further in reminding us that since this is true, others' concerns for their lives and livelihoods and those of their families should be our concern, too - not to forget their eternal salvation. Here is part of that discourse:

12 remember that at that time you were separate from Christ, excluded from citizenship in Israel and foreigners to the covenants of the promise, without hope and without God in the world. 13 But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far away have been brought near by the blood of Christ.

14 For he himself is our peace, who has made the two groups one and has destroyed the barrier, the dividing wall of hostility,

Our righteousness has two dimensions - a 'vertical' one in regard to God, but a 'horizontal' one, too, in regards to our neighbors - no matter where they are or what they look like. Jesus has taken care of the first. Our righteousness before God was accomplished by Him in His death and resurrection. But our civil righteousness is also up to us - as is the peace and prosperity of all while in this world.

Yes, we are 'pilgrims' in a sense in this world, as the King James Bible describes us in 1 Peter and Hebrews, but we are also citizens in every way in this world, too - as long as we live in it, with the responsibility to be God's people in it - with His grace and help. May we endeavor to be worthy of that call, even as our eternal worthiness comes only by His grace through our faith. Amen.

SIXTY-SEVENTH CONVENTION OF THE NORTHWEST DISTRICT, LCMS

The Sixty-Seventh Convention of the Northwest District, LCMS, will be held at the Spokane Convention Center in Spokane, Washington, on June 19-21, 2025. The District Convention provides the congregations and rostered workers of the district an opportunity for worship, nurture, inspiration, fellowship, and the communication of vital information. This is the principal legislative assembly of the District for considering and taking action on reports and overtures as well as electing District officers, including District President, 1st Vice President, and Regional Vice Presidents.

Each congregation of the District is allowed to send two voting delegates: one lay delegate and one pastoral delegate. Trinity Lutheran Church in Oregon City needs to elect a lay delegate (and alternate) to attend the District Convention. The church will pay for the delegates' registration, transportation, lodging, and meals for the convention.

We will be electing our lay delegate (and alternate) at the November congregational meeting. 2023–2025 MISSION GRANT NO. 20 | SHARING CHRIST WITH WOMEN & CHILDREN IN KAZAKHSTAN | LUTHERAN HOUR MINISTRIES | \$100,000

Kazakh Women and Children Hear the Gospel of Jesus

Kazakhstan is a large landlocked country in central Asia and a former member of the USSR. The population of 20,086,000 is 70% Muslim and about 26% Christian. Lutheran Hour Ministries (LHM) is working with local churches to serve women and children and uses digital outreach and printed Christian resources to reach the unchurched. Government restrictions allow spreading the Gospel only through local churches or house churches in small towns. Traditionally the people come from nomadic populations where extreme poverty in remote villages is very common. Women face many challenges due to the economic situation, unemployment, alcoholism, rising food prices, and general religious apathy among the male population.

Gospel proclamation is difficult due to harassment from non-Christian religious authorities and unbelieving family members. LHM-Kazakhstan is one of few Christian organizations that is allowed by the government to share the Gospel throughout the whole country. The outreach is done primarily through training programs for youth and women church leaders, children's programs and youth programs, holistic ministry, publishing Christian materials in the Kazakh and Russian languages, and digital outreach and online Bible courses. LHM-Kazakhstan broadcasts its Christian radio and television programming on the internet where it is even more widely viewed.

The LHM staff and other Christian women meet with non-Christian women in special classes at churches to study the Bible, pray, share faith, and receive quality Christian materials that are published at the ministry center. The children receive Bible story and activity booklets, and they attend vacation Bible school and Sunday school.

Thred.asia, LHM's digital outreach platform for youth, deepens relationships with non-Christians and is a safe place to share the hope in Jesus. LHM-Kazakhstan will expand their Gospel outreach to share the hope and love of Jesus to a country of spiritual and physical poverty.

"Give thanks to the LORD, call upon his name, make known his deeds among the peoples, proclaim that his name is exalted. Sing praises to the LORD, for he has done gloriously; let this be made known in all the earth" (Isaiah 12:4–5).



2023–2025 MISSION GRANT NO. 22 | EXPANDING GOSPEL OUTREACH TO HISPANICS | LUTHERAN HOUR MINISTRIES | \$100,000

Hispanics Hearing and Reading God's Word

The mission of Lutheran Hour Ministries (LHM) is bringing Christ to the Nations — and the Nations to the Church. Lutheran Hour Ministries has a great opportunity to expand its Gospel outreach to Hispanics, the second largest ethnic group in the United States, with Christian resources, and media and outreach technology in the Spanish language in ways that are applicable to daily life. The Good News of salvation will be shared by working with LCMS ministry leaders, churches, districts, universities, and seminaries to encourage outreach to Hispanics.



The primary focus of this grant is to reach those in the United States who identify as Hispanic, with their main language being Spanish. This mission grant will let our Hispanic brothers and sisters hear God's message of salvation in Spanish through a powerful Christian witness of love that will strengthen and encourage them to faith in Jesus Christ. To reach our Hispanic friends, coworkers, neighbors, and family members, LHM is doing more than just translating English materials into Spanish. It is also developing programming and media content for Hispanics by Hispanics.

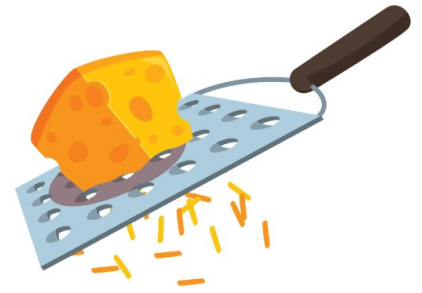
Hispanics today can be reached across all social media platforms and channels. This grant will allow LHM to further expand their media outreach technology podcasts, such as Para el Camino, Sentido Latino, and Vivenciar.net. Podcasts are an easy way for individuals to listen to LHM programs and resources at any time. Besides the digital programming, LHM continues translating Project Connect booklets that help Hispanic people face life's challenges in a Christ-centered way.

With very limited Hispanic Lutheran Christian resources, this mission grant will support the church at large for outreach to Hispanics and bring them into the family of believers.

"And he made from one man every nation of mankind to live on all the face of the earth, having determined allotted periods and the boundaries of their dwelling place" (Acts 17:26).
