WORDS FROM THE PASTOR

I grew up in Camas, WA. Camas was a bit smaller back then, maybe 7000 or so. Our athletic teams competed with relatively small "AA" schools. In addition, Camas didn't produce a lot of big kids back then either. So when it came to my senior year in football, I went "both ways". On defense I played linebacker, which I loved. On offense I played tackle, which I didn't. At 170 lbs. I just didn't see myself as a typical offensive lineman. One day I went into the coach's office and expressed my belief that I could do a better job at linebacker if I wasn't also playing tackle. His reply was that he could find other players that could handle the linebacker position, but what he *needed* was a tackle. I thanked him, turned around, and quietly disappeared. I wasn't going to risked the position that I loved.

On a football team there are positions that seem more glamorous or fun: quarterback, halfbacks, ends, and linebackers. And there are positions that seem less glamorous or fun: center, guards, or tackles. Yet for a team to score and win they are *all* important, every one of them. It doesn't take long for a backfield to get into deep trouble, offensively or defensively, if the line is not doing its job.

The same is true in the Church. All "positions" are important. All are critical if a church is to fulfill its mission. While I served at St. John Lutheran Church in Vancouver as their *Director of Christian Outreach* I did a lot of reading, mostly books on outreach. One of my favorites was a book called *Becoming a Contagious Christian*. I liked it so well I bought a copy for each of the other staff. It had many good things to share, but what I remember most was how it described the church as sort of a team. I don't remember if they used that exact metaphor, but that is how I recall it.

Every person at a church is important. And God has given each one of us gifts and talents to be used in his service and to share the Gospel of Christ. Moreover, he has created each of us with a personality to match. We don't have to change who we are to share Jesus. In fact, that would be counterproductive. We all do it differently. We all have our "position" to fill. Some are very outgoing and talkative. Some are shy and reserved. Some Christians are very action oriented and want to get things done quickly and *now*. Some are very patient and good listeners. They take their time. We need both. Some can cook, drive a car, or sew a quilt. Some can make a church beautiful and inviting. Some are simply good at showing compassion, sharing God's love, offering invitations. Some are good at shaking hands and saying "welcome" or "can I help you?" All of these gifts can be useful to advance the Kingdom of God. All of these gifts can benefit the "team" in their goal. And if they are missing, the team suffers.

How has God blessed you? Are you a quarterback, halfback, or end? Or are you a center, guard, or tackle? What kind of personality has he given you? How might God have equipped you to share the certain kind of blessing that you have to offer? Think about it... Pray about it.

CALL COMMITTEE UPDATE

The Call Committee has recently received the names of eleven pastors for Trinity to consider for our call list from District President Reverend Michael Von Behren. The Call Committee will now read through the information sent to us about each of these pastors and will then decide which ones the committee will contact to see if they are open to talking with us about our pastoral position. The Call Committee will then conduct interviews with the pastors who are open to considering a Call from Trinity and then the committee will present the results of those interviews to Trinity's congregation. After the congregation has had time to study the information about each of the pastors that has been interviewed, we will then have a special Congregational Call Meeting so that Trinity's members can decide who the congregation would like to Call as our next pastor. This process will take at least several months to complete.

The Call Committee is made up of 12 members: Elders Jeff Allen, Al Bohr, Ray Clack, Levi Darnell, Cary Martenson, Craig Nickles, and Dave Wilson, as well as Sheila Wahl, Carolyn Stucky, Ahtia Clack, Stanette Rosenberger, and Beth Wilson. A section of the property to the west of the church driveway, to the west property line and all the way back to the garage/shop has been under development for several years – partly as grounds maintenance and fire protection but also with a view to creating a nature park for use by members and their families.

Already a work in progress, a park will be part of the master plan. Facilities Manager, Herb Meissel, recently had the area logged of dead trees and cleaned up. A small picnic pavilion was donated and will be installed near the front. Access, pathways and an amphitheater are planned – member volunteer help with this work would be very helpful, please contact Herb if you are willing.

Our park will offer opportunities to bring together small groups and member families for R&R and sharing. An environment to encourage our youth to join in prayer/praise/service beyond the church walls.

Our park needs a proper name. The congregation is asked to help the Church Council decide. Please feel free to offer suggestions to Council Members as the work continues.

LIBRARY



#3 Life-Changing Care for People in the Dominican Republic Living with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities - \$6500

The LCMS started mission work in the Dominican Republic in 2005 with a specific emphasis on improving the lives of people with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) by providing spiritual, physical, and emotional care as Children of God.



Six young adults living in a group home, Hogares Luteranos el Buen Pastor (Good Shephard Lutheran Home), need continued care while confronting the way a country cares for God's children with disabilities. This home allows residents to remain in their Dominican community while interacting with neighbors, friends, church members, and visitors as they grow in Jesus's love and His Word.

#2 New Life Children's Center Spiritual Program - \$6500

Lutheran Social Services of the South (DBA Upbring) is a faith-based organization in Texas with strong connections to the Lutheran Church. Upbring New Life Children's Center provides safety, structure, and supportive healing for abused and neglected young girls aged 11–17 through individualized education, therapy, and spiritual care provided by this grant. Promoting Christ's healing through a healthy relationship with God leads to resiliency and breaking the generational cycle of abuse and poverty.
